Summary of evidence and Expert Committee recommendations

The EMLc Subcommittee endorsed the inclusion of ketamine on the core list of the EMLc as an injectable anaesthetic medicine. The Subcommittee noted that ketamine is a very useful anaesthetic agent in children, and also noted the concern about its central nervous system adverse effects.
