Summary of evidence and Expert Committee recommendations

Following the review of the age-appropriateness of formulations on the EMLc, the Expert Committee recommended: - to delete the listing of chloroquine for malaria chemoprevention from the EML and EMLc, noting that doxycycline is no longer recommended for this indication in WHO guidelines.
